












SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING & MATHS with Chan, each Monday

What we have been learning about:

Emotions have been a strong topic throughout all SEL classes. We have looked at the wide range of emotions and learning how they can be expressed. It is important to show emotions clearly so others understand how we are feeling. We have also looked at the value of friendships and our relationships with others.

Last week, students enjoyed team activities and worked on teamwork skills such as cooperation, communication, listening, sharing, problem solving and encouraging others. We spoke about how our personal skills have a role to play during team activities. 
ORANGE DAY AT MKPS! Wear something orange! Thursday 21st March
