**THANK YOU:** A huge thanks you to Nicole and Lis for wrapping the Easter donations for raffle prizes. Your time is much appreciated!

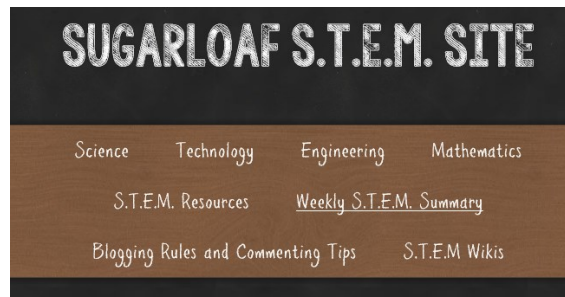

## SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING & MATHS *with Chan, each Monday*

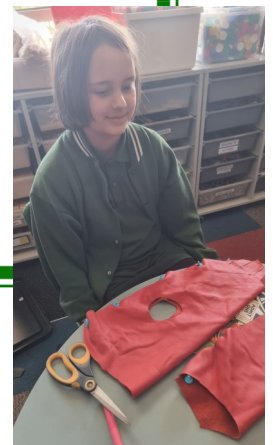
